## Key achievements to date:

- 1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
  - Equipment in place to enable children to be active at break and lunchtime including table tennis to support clubs
  - We have 2 hours of PE curriculum time for all year groups
  - The majority of pupils bring their PE kit for lessons- this doesn't affect participation as spares are provided. Year 5 and 6 wear PE kits to school post-Covid. This makes lesson turn around faster and allows for best use of time
  - KS1 active assemblies once a week
  - Reception-physical development targets ongoing
  - Active brain breaks throughout KS2
  - Outdoor lessons where appropriate
  - More, alternative clubs on offer for 2021-2022 including parkour and Zumba as links with the wider community continue to grow
- 2. the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for wholeschool improvement
  - PE Policy recently updated and linked to whole school plan
  - Weekly assembly celebrating sporting success- this is in place to celebrate achievements both inside and outside of school to further generate a sense of pride. Parents email in photos to add to celebration display outside Year 6 classroom. Class Dojo reaches wider community audience to share sporting achievements and fixtures
  - Noticeboards in place displaying certificates and information
  - Dojo forms an important pathway for communication for year groups
- 3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
  - Options to observe fully qualified PE coaches (FGS)
  - Units of Work in place for all PE Lessons
  - Downloading existing planning. Dance Scheme bought in to
  - More staff members willing to involve themselves in extra-curricular events and activities than before

## Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

- 1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
  - Lesson times can sometimes be inactive highlighted on heat map from Active School Planner for some year groups
  - Need to take advantage of more national initiatives; e.g. change4life. national fitness day, CBBC super movers and primary stars
- 2. the profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for wholeschool improvement
  - Need to reapply for School Games Mark would like to aim for Platinum
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
  - Assessment Framework for PE needs developing
  - Further CPD training needs identified with Games & Swimming being key areas
  - More links required for mental health and wellbeing
  - Staff to complete yearly sports provision map to cover objectives to fulfil curriculum requirements based on skills-based lessons
  - Staff planning to be clear and tailored to individual needs. This can be taken from the internet and annotated but needs to be accessible on the school server
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Monitoring means that this is continually updated and tracked in accordance with individual/class/year group/school need
- increased participation in competitive sport
- Continue as previous years











- 4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
  - Range of after school clubs on offer to all pupils.
  - All year groups have the opportunity to attend sporting events and festivals enabling all children to take part (inclusive of SEN)
  - Qualified Sports Coach running a minimum of 3 weekly clubs every half term beginning Summer 1 due to restrictions in place
  - First Grade Sport coaching is absolutely pivotal in allowing for us to offer such a wide range and variety of provision both inside and outside of school
  - Rigorous tracking of clubs, competitions and festivals allows us to target individual children, ensuring that as many pupils as possible have the opportunity to participate and represent the school in some format
  - Refer to percentages from the breakdown with a comparison with national average. In each sense, Firfield is up on national averages which is a huge achievement considering the effects that lockdown could have had on the children at our school.
- 5. increased participation in competitive sport
  - Attending a variety of sporting events and competitions run by Erewash School Sport Partnership (all year groups).
  - Gained School Games Mark Gold for the fourth consecutive year
  - Developed school football teams (Yr 5/6) and entered festivals and competitions to an incredible degree of success both as part of the ESSP and around Derbyshire in independent leagues and cup tournaments
  - County invites for table tennis teams and individual stand-out performers to represent Derbyshire
  - County Champions in Girls' football and Boys' Table Tennis- boys to represent Derbyshire in the regional finals in the Spring Term
  - Level 3 qualification in Hockey
  - County qualification for SEN Boccia
  - Well-established basketball team and the continued development of Futsal
  - Record number of events entered solely for girls this academic year
  - Intra-school competition is strong and implemented throughout the sporting curriculum of each year group. This is supported by x3 weekly lunchtime clubs facilitated by FGS
  - Mini-leaders continue to run pupil-led activities during lunchtimes with younger children to create healthier relationships with staying active on the playground













- Young Ambassadors run their own competitions and tournaments, umpiring and organising with autonomy. These pupils therefore act as role models and are extremely proactive in improving provision and giving input during assembly times with news and updates. This has definitely become a role to aspire to. This has also developed with the early introduction of This Girl Can Ambassadors who have also held their own Cross Country competition and led assemblies (see Twitter feed)
- Playmakers, once trained during the first half term, work to support clubs, allowing for more opportunities for participation with larger group sizes
- Parental involvement means that we are no longer confined to the school grounds for clubs and more pupils can be accepted due to larger ratio sizes
- Links with the wider community continue to grow- PE Lead actively seeking to provide opportunities to pupils who may otherwise have been disengaged with the more 'generic' sporting activities in favour of parkour, Zumba and kickboxing.
