Message from Mr Yellop

Thank you to all the parents that completed the questionnaire sent out last month. There was a wealth of positive responses and some areas we can improve on as a school.

For the first three questions on the survey, we were delighted with the responses although there is always room for improvement. Firstly 92% of parents felt their child was happy at school compared to the national average of 89%. We were also pleased that 94% of parents agreed that their child feels safe at school compared to 91% nationally. 90% of parents felt that the school makes sure its pupils behave well, above the national average of 84%. We are really pleased with this as we have worked hard on promoting exemplary behaviour and reducing low level disruption that can be a barrier to learning. 94% of parents (compared to 80% nationally) agreed that the school makes them aware of what the children are learning during the year. We have tried hard to keep parents informed of the new curriculum through the website and via class Dojo. We also had many positive comments about our knowledge-rich curriculum and the details that the children are remembering and how much they are enjoying what is being taught and learned.

Across most of the questions more parents replied with strongly agreed than on the previous survey sent out in the last academic year. To some of the questions a number of parents replied 'Don't know' to some of the questions, especially 'The school supports my child's wider personal development' so we will try and communicate our provision more clearly in the future.


We were a little disappointed by the response to the question 'My Child can take part in clubs and activities at the school', where 82% agreed compared to 88% nationally. As a school we offer lots of clubs and activities compared to other schools. We will continue to look at this offer to ensure we give all children the opportunity to attend a range of clubs and activities during their time at the school.

Finally, we are very happy that 91% (compared to 85% nationally) of parents would recommend the school, we have a growing reputation in the area and have seen a recent increase in pupil numbers. Thank you to all the parents who responded to our survey. We will look at how we can make any changes in response to the constructive feedback and comments we have received. As our motto says we 'learn together', 'grow together' and 'achieve together'.


World Autism Awareness Day
