If school meals are free for reception, year 1 and year 2 - why do I still need to apply?



All children in reception, year 1 and year 2 get free school meals, but if you receive one of the qualifying benefits you may also get help with:

- the cost of residential school trips
- travel costs to school
- school uniform costs
 music lessons at school

For every child registered for free school meals, schools receive a pupil premium payment each year. This will be used to help your child achieve their best at school.

Uniform

As parents are preparing for a new school year and new term, I wanted to send out a reminder about school uniform. The following dress code is expected at all times:

Winter uniform

- Dark green cardigan or jumper
- Yellow polo shirt
- Mid grey skirt/ pinafore dress
- Mid grey trousers
- Grey / black or white tights or socks
- Black sensible school shoes

Suitable hair styling should be encouraged in school for example no hair dyes or extravagant hairstyles - mohawks or shaved patterns in hair.

P.E. Requirements

- Black plimsolls
- Black P.E. shorts / 'skorts'
- Plain white T shirt

In addition to indoor P.E. it is expected that the children will take part in activities outside so the following items are required:

- A plain black tracksuit/ or dark jogging trousers with a black tracksuit top or fleece.
- Plain trainers suitable for sporting activities

(Football shirts will not be allowed for PE)
