These can be dropped off outside the reading lodge on the 23rd and 24th November or between 2:00pm - 4:00pm on Saturday 25th.

Delivery and Collection Policy

A reminder to all parents and carers that whilst the school gates open at 8.45am, we ask adults to stay with the children until the whistle goes at 8.55am to ensure children are supervised at all times. When the whistle goes and children line up in their classes then the teachers will take over that responsibility. Any children who arrive after 9.05am will need to go to the office as the register will have already been taken and this will go down as a 'Late' mark. At 9.05am the gates on Sawley Road will be locked followed by the main gates. We also ask that any Year 6 children who are permitted to walk to school without a parent do not arrive before 8.45am.

In the afternoon the gates will be opened at 3.25pm. We ask that they are picked up only by a parent or responsible adult. Only Siblings 14 years and older are also permitted to pick up younger siblings. Parents / carers must inform their child's class teacher or school office if there is a change to the collection arrangements for a child on any certain day to ensure the class teacher has the necessary information. Please contact the school office directly if there is a change during the day to collection arrangements rather than via class email / Class Dojo as these messages may not be read during the day.
