<u>Sustainable Futures</u>

As part of our drive towards net zero and improving school sustainability we are involved in lots of different opportunities to reduce energy and water waste, increase biodiversity and improve our travel, helping to reduce pollution to ensure we look after our environment. We have been granted £10,000 from East Midlands Airport to install solar panels. We are changing some of our electrical lighting and devices to more energy efficient one and looking for ways to save water. In November many children were trained through Bikeability and this month we continue to promote alternative ways of travelling. To support this, we have signed up to a national initiative called 'Cycle Bells', encouraging pupils, family and staff to cycle, scoot or walk to school throughout the month of December.
